### »Pannonia Research Awards«

Awards for applied research at the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland

#### Topic

“Future issues in the departments of Business Studies, Information and Communication Technology and Management, Social Work, Energy and Environmental Management and Health”

#### Aims and Objectives

The Pannonia Research Awards are designed to encourage research and publishing activities in the research areas offered by the programmes of study of the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland. With the creation of these awards, teachers, researchers and junior researchers (current students and graduates) who have submitted excellent papers on the theme of these awards, “Future issues in the departments of Business Studies, Information and Communication Technology and Management, Energy and Environmental Management, Health and Social Work” will be rewarded and gain recognition for their endeavours.

#### Eligibility Criteria

The Pannonia Research Awards are targeted at teachers, researchers and junior researchers – students and graduates of the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland, European universities and European higher education institutions in the categories “**Pannonia Research Award for Teachers and Researchers**” and “**Pannonia Research Award for Junior Researchers**”.

Criteria for the work are that the research:

- is presented in German or English and that the formal aspects of academic writing conventions are adhered to (see [guidelines for papers](#)), and is not a resubmission in the framework of the Pannonia Research Awards, although papers submitted for other awards will be accepted; this must be made apparent on submission along with a disclaimer;
- The aim of the “**Pannonia Research Awards**” is to reward papers which fall into one of the different key competence areas offered by the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland (Business Studies, Information and Communication Technology and Management, Social Work, Energy and Environmental Management, Health);
- Papers for the “**Pannonia Research Award for Teachers and Researchers**” should comprise approximately ten pages, should not be more than two years old and in a suitable form for publishing. Further, the content and form should be at a level similar to other papers published in appropriate academic literature.
- Papers for the “**Pannonian Research Award for Junior Researchers**” should comprise approximately six pages, should not be more than two years old and in a suitable form for publishing. Approbated master theses and other individual works of graduates no older than two years can be submitted.
- Award winning entries will be published (the award winners will receive free copies). By signing the submission you affirm that no rights of third persons, especially copyrights, will be violated. Publishing rights only in connection with the Pannonia Research Award will be assigned to the University of Applied Sciences, who is not responsible for any claims from third parties. The right of the author to publish independently is not affected.
- The jury’s decision is final and cannot be appealed against.

- By signing the submission (see document "Einreichung Unterschrift") participants accept all the conditions mentioned above.

The following additional information should accompany the application:

- Name and address of the researcher (including telephone number and e-mail address)
- Name and mail address of the supervisor

The selection of the applications received will be made by an academic jury using a double blind system. Originality, academic quality and applicability will be taken into consideration. (The jury's decision is final and cannot be appealed against.)

### **Target Group**

Entries for the Pannonia Research Awards will be welcomed from teachers, researchers and junior researchers (students and graduates) from the University of Applied Sciences Burgenland and European universities or higher education institutions.
